

CALL TO ORDER

The Presbytery was called to order at 10:00 a.m. by Moderator Stephen Baldwin.

GREETINGS AND OPENING BUSINESS

Pastor Stephen Baldwin welcomed Presbytery.

Acting Stated Clerk Jim Robinson recognized and welcomed ministers new to the Presbytery and invited them to sign the Book of Obligations: Ed Bowen, serving Bates Memorial Church, Huntington; and David Bower, Honorably Retired.

Robinson recognized and welcomed visitors and elder commissioners attending their first Presbytery meeting.

The Moderator recognized Forrest Palmer who introduced the new Office Administrator, Leslie Curtis. Curtis announced that the Presbytery will be introducing a new e-newsletter soon.

Robinson stated that a quorum was present with 37 Teaching Elders, Ruling Elders from 38 churches, and seven Commissioned Lay Pastors. (Attendance record in Appendix A, pages 166-172.)

Robinson moved the approval of the docket. After receiving a second, the docket was **approved** as presented. (Appendix B, page 173.)

The Moderator appointed members present of the Presbytery Worship, Review and Polity Committee as the Committee on Bills and Overtures.

WORSHIP

The meeting began with worship and celebration of the Lord's Supper led by Nancy Bulla and Sharon Rowe, Liturgists; John McKinnon, Preacher; Barbara Romfo and Stephen Baldwin, Celebrants; Rodger and Leah Trent, Musicians. An offering of \$1051 was received for the Christmas Joy Offering.

ANNOUNCEMENTS

Presbytery heard announcements from Nelle Howard from the Bluestone Committee and Karen Robinson, Director of the Presbytery Resource Center.

PROGRAM

Forrest Palmer, Todd Wright and Nancy Tissue led Presbytery in a time of instruction concerning the new configuration of churches into clusters. Presbytery met in the cluster groups and shared ideas for working together in ministry.

MINUTE FOR MISSION

The Moderator recognized Claire Butler who presented a Minute for Mission on the Joy Gift Offering.

AFTERNOON PRAYER

After a recess for lunch, Presbytery reconvened with Afternoon Prayer led by Sally Woodard and Susan Sharp Campbell, Liturgists; and Rodger and Leah Trent, Musicians. A dedication of new Authorized Lay Preachers was included: John Arbuckle, Laura Bogess, Betsy Crockett, Jim Johnston, George Lilley, Nancy Martin, Sylvia Miles, Mary Odin, Wayne Odin, John Nelson, Kellan Sarles, Beverly Sharp, Mike Stivers, Becky Williams, and John Yeager.

PROCEDURAL MATTERS

Acting Stated Clerk Jim Robinson led Presbytery in a brief orientation and presented the Procedures as shown in the docket. Robinson moved item C.3 which limited debate. After receiving a second, Presbytery **approved** the motion by two-thirds vote. (Appendix C, page 174.)

STATED CLERK'S REPORT

Acting Stated Clerk Jim Robinson presented his report.

1. 09/04/12. Letter dated 8/29/12 from The Synod of the Trinity informing the Presbytery that the Synod Per Capita Apportionment for 2013 is \$2.20, unchanged since 2011.

2. 09/04/12. E-mail message from Rev. Howard Shockley, Stated Clerk of the Presbytery of Mid Atlantic, Evangelical Presbyterian Church, stating that they are prepared to fully receive the Princeton Church and the Rev. Ed Pettus from the Presbytery of West Virginia.

ACTION: Referred to COM to support action taken at the 9/11/12 Presbytery meeting to dismiss the Princeton church to the EPC, and to act on Ed Pettus' request to be transferred.

COMMITTEE ON MINISTRY

The Moderator recognized Randy Fife who presented the report of the Committee on Ministry.

RECOMMENDATIONS: (CA means Consent Agenda)

- 1. (CA) The renewal of the covenant as Ruling Elder Commissioned to a Particular Pastoral Service for Kari J. Preslar and Falls View through December 31, 2013, be approved. Terms: Cash salary: \$525 per month; lead services each Sunday and weekly Bible Study when appropriate; auto reimbursement at IRS rate; vacation: 2 weeks plus 2 Sundays for Presbytery work; continuing education \$200 per year; responsibilities: Preach, conduct special services, visit the sick in Charleston when possible; authority to administer the Lord's Supper, baptisms, weddings; moderate Session; voice and vote at presbytery.
- 2. (CA) The renewal of the covenant as Ruling Elder Commissioned to a Particular Pastoral Service for Jean Summerfield and Eleanor through December 31, 2013 be approved. Terms: Salary: \$300 per month (10 hours per week); auto reimbursement at IRS rate; housing \$700; vacation: 4 weeks including Sundays; continuing education: 2 weeks including Sundays; conduct worship for 46 Sundays and special days; call upon those in need; support the programs of the church, especially Sunday school; teach special studies as requested; specific days of ministry (other than above): Ash Wednesday, Maundy Thursday, Easter, Ascension Thursday, Christmas Eve; authority to administer the Lord's Supper, baptize, perform weddings, moderate Session, voice and vote at Presbytery.
- 3. (CA) The renewal of the covenant as Ruling Elder Commissioned to a Particular Pastoral Service for G. David Allen and Kingwood, First though May 31, 2013 be approved. Terms: Salary: \$839.83 per month (annual \$10,078)(2 days—16 hours per week), Social Security withheld \$64.25 per month; travel reimbursement at IRS rate (up to \$2,400 per year); up to \$3,400 per year for medical reimbursement; vacation: 5 weeks including 5 Sundays; study leave 2 weeks including 2 Sundays (up to \$1,200 per year for continuing education); conduct worship, emergency pastoral care, officiate at funerals; participate in church fellowship activities when possible; make visits to home bound, grieving or sick and to those with special needs or concerns; pray with and for the congregation; attend Presbytery meetings voice and vote); maintain a life of peace and prayer; authority to administer Lord's Supper, baptize, moderate Session, perform marriages.

- 4. (CA) The renewal of the covenant as Ruling Elder Commissioned to a Particular Pastoral Service for Jeff Barton and Trinity (Shady Spring) through December 31, 2013 be approved. Terms: Salary: \$18,000 per year (18 hours per week); travel reimbursement at IRS rate; out of pocket expenses incurred while attending meetings, etc. at Session request; vacation: one week earned every 12 weeks and can be accumulated up to 2 weeks; continuing education with authorization from Session; conduct Adult Bible Study class every Sunday at 10:00 to 10:30; conduct worship 11:00 to noon; moderate Session after worship (minimum 6 Session meetings/maximum of 12); prepare bulletin for reproduction; conduct Christmas Eve service; authority to administer Lord's Supper, baptize, perform marriages; voice and vote at Presbytery.
- 5. (CA) The renewal of the covenant as Ruling Elder Commissioned to a Particular Pastoral Service for William Francis Brown and Ruffner Memorial (Charleston) through December 31, 2013 be approved. Terms: Salary (paid twice monthly in 24 installments): \$15,833 per year (no less than 20 hours per week), SECA offset, \$1,940, Utilities, \$1,600, Manse Fair Rental \$6,000, manse equity \$500; medical dues \$8,400, pension dues \$2,720, continuing education \$1,000; travel reimbursement at .555/mile; vacation: 4 weeks; study leave 2 weeks; prepare/preach sermons and conduct Sunday services, conduct at least one Communion Service per month; moderate stated and called Session meetings; represent church at Presbytery meetings; visit and keep contact with members with special needs; conduct weddings and funerals; provide supervision of staff per agreement with Senior Services employment program; assist Session committees to increase witness; authority to baptize; voice and vote at Presbytery.
- 6. (CA) The renewal of the covenant as Ruling Elder Commissioned to a Particular Pastoral Service for Nancy Bulla and Union through December 31, 2013 be approved. Terms: Salary: \$20,600 per year (20 hours+); other items of finance or reimbursement when needed; vacation: 4 weeks including Sundays; study leave: 2 weeks including Sundays; lead worship and preach 4 or 5 times each month, Christmas Eve; moderate Session meetings, visitation in hospitals, nursing homes, private homes; lead Bible study, lead outreach evangelism, participate in walk on Good Friday (optional), attend Presbytery meetings; authority to administer Lord's Supper, baptize, perform marriages, funerals; voice and vote at Presbytery.
- 7. (CA) The renewal of the covenant as Ruling Elder Commissioned to a Particular Pastoral Service for William Dunfee and Westminster (Vienna) through December 31, 2013 be approved. Terms: Salary \$2,738.50 per month (25 hours per week); travel reimbursement at IRS rate; reimbursement for preparation or study materials; vacation: 4 weeks; continuing education as approved by Session; conduct Sunday worship, lead weekly Bible study, visit or call upon congregation members; authority to administer Lord's Supper, baptize, moderate Session, perform marriages, voice and vote at Presbytery; sixty (60) days notice (rather than standard 30) for termination, by either party.
- 8. (CA) The renewal of the covenant as Ruling Elder Commissioned to a Particular Pastoral Service for Roger Eskins and Comfort through December 31, 2013 be approved. Terms: Salary \$800 per month (20 to 30 hours, 2.5 days specific to ministry);

travel reimbursement at IRS rate (\$350 per month); vacation: 4 weeks; continuing education: \$500 per year on request; conduct Sunday morning worship, weekly Bible study, hospital visitation, home visitation, choir leader; authority to administer Lord's Supper, conduct funerals and weddings, baptize, moderate Session; voice and vote at Presbytery.

- 9. (CA) The renewal of the covenant as Ruling Elder Commissioned to a Particular Pastoral Service for James Harless and Kenova, First through December 31, 2013 be approved, except for the authority to moderate congregational meetings, pending Presbytery approval of that authority by separate recommendation. Terms: Salary: \$13,800 per year; Social Security \$2,237; travel reimbursement at 14.5 cents per mile; vacation: 4 weeks including Sundays; continuing education: 2 weeks including Sundays (\$400); preach at Sunday morning services, co-lead Bible study, office hours on Wednesdays, visit sick and shut-ins, attend Presbytery meetings, remain under case of Presbytery, special work services including funerals, weddings, Lord's Supper and baptisms; moderate Session; voice and vote at Presbytery.
- 10. (CA) The renewal of the covenant as Ruling Elder Commissioned to a Particular Pastoral Service for Thomas J. Hastie and Milton through December 31, 2013 be approved. Terms: Salary: \$600 per month (less than 20 hours per week—specific days of ministry Wednesday and Sunday); \$4,640 per year housing allowance; travel reimbursement at current IRS rate (\$600 yearly); \$350 per year book allowance; vacation/continuing education: 4 Sundays/yearly with 30 days notice; conduct Sunday service, Wednesday Bible study, seasonal services (Sunrise service, Christmas Eve, Maundy Thursday, Ash Wednesday, recognition of National Day of Prayer, etc.); pastoral care, attend Presbytery meetings; authority to administer Lord's Supper, baptize, perform marriages, moderate Session, voice and vote at Presbytery.
- 11. (CA) The renewal of the covenant as Ruling Elder Commissioned to a Particular Pastoral Service for David E. Pettry and Clear Creek through December 31, 2013 be approved. Terms: Salary: \$85 per week (12 to 15 hours per week); conduct worship; authority to administer the Lord's Supper, baptize, perform funerals and weddings, moderate Session, voice and vote at Presbytery.
- 12. (CA) The renewal of the covenant as Ruling Elder Commissioned to a Particular Pastoral Service for David E. Pettry and Colcord, First through December 31, 2013 be approved. Terms: Salary: \$125 per week (12 hours per week, 2 Sundays per month rotate on 5th Sunday); vacation: 2 Sundays per year; continuing education: as requested; lead Sunday services, visitation as regular job permits; authority to administer the Lord's Supper, baptize, perform funerals and weddings, moderate Session, voice and vote at Presbytery.
- 13. (CA) The renewal of the covenant as Ruling Elder Commissioned to a Particular Pastoral Service for David E. Pettry and Marsh Fork through December 31, 2013 be approved, except for the authority to moderate congregational meetings, pending Presbytery approval of that authority by separate recommendation. Terms: Salary: \$125 per week (15 hours per week); preaching, visitations; authority to administer the Lord's Supper,

baptize, perform funerals and weddings, moderate Session, voice and vote at Presbytery.

- 14. (CA) The renewal of the covenant as Ruling Elder Commissioned to a Particular Pastoral Service for Cherrie L. Sizemore and Winfield through December 31, 2013 be approved. Terms: Salary: \$800 per month (12 hours per week; specific days vary); travel reimbursement included in salary; vacation: 4 weeks; continuing education: 2 weeks study leave; lead worship from 11:00 to 12:00 noon each Sunday, provide spiritual guidance, encouragement and pastoral care to all members, visit with homebound or ill members, serve communion at least 4 times per year; authority to administer the Lord's Supper, baptize, perform funerals and weddings, moderate Session, voice and vote at Presbytery.
- Particular Pastoral Service for Elizabeth Stone and Bradley through December 31, 2013 be approved. Terms: Salary: \$1,152.33 per month (14 hours per week); \$533.33 per month with \$300 housing/utilities plus Social Security withheld \$69 per month; travel reimbursement at IRS rate for travel in the performance of duties (\$1,800 per year); retirement compensation \$1,200 per year; vacation: 4 weeks at Pastor's choice; continuing education: 2 weeks at Pastor's choice (\$500 per year); conduct worship at 9:30 a.m. Sundays; serve communion first Sunday in every quarter and in homes when needed; moderate Session every other month (scheduled at Pastor's choice); committee help; visit shut-ins, hospitals, nursing homes, prospective members as needed; hold church office hours one day per week at Pastor's choice; authority to administer the Lord's Supper, baptize, perform funerals and weddings, moderate Session.
- 16. (CA) The renewal of the covenant as Ruling Elder Commissioned to a Particular Pastoral Service for Elizabeth Stone and Mt. Hope through December 31, 2013 be approved. Terms: Salary: \$1,695.15 per month (26 hours per week); travel reimbursement at IRS rate (\$3,900 per year); retirement allowance \$2,441.04 per year; Social Security \$1,684.32 per year; vacation: 4 weeks; continuing education: 2 weeks (\$500 per year); conduct worship at 11:00 a.m. Sundays; administer communion including homebound; hospital and nursing home visitation; authority to administer the Lord's Supper, baptize, perform funerals and weddings, moderate Session.
- 17. (CA) The renewal of the covenant as Ruling Elder Commissioned to a Particular Pastoral Service for Kari J. Preslar and Montgomery through December 31, 2013 be approved. Terms: Salary: \$432 per month (flexible time limitations); travel reimbursement at IRS rate (\$132 per month); vacation: two Sundays plus two Sundays for Presbytery work; continuing education: \$200; preach every Sunday, work with or share in special services (Ash Wednesday, Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, Easter, Pentecost, Advent, Christmas), assist in annual elder training; visit sick members in Charleston and Montgomery areas, Bible study as requested; authority to administer the Lord's Supper, baptize, moderate Session, perform marriages and funerals; voice and vote at Presbytery.
- 18. (CA) The renewal of the covenant as Ruling Elder Commissioned to a Particular Pastoral Service for Robert Lynn Randolph and Spring Creek through December 31, 2013 be approved. Terms: Salary: \$1,300 per month (20 hours); travel reimbursement

- at IRS rate; match Social Security withheld and pay half the cost of educational material; vacation: 4 weeks including Sundays; Sunday morning worship leadership plus special services at Christmas and Easter as determined by the Session; weekly Bible study; home and hospital visitation; authority to administer the Lord's Supper, baptize, moderate Session, perform marriages and funerals; voice and vote at Presbytery
- 19. (CA) The renewal of the covenant as Lay Supply for James Dempsey and Kesler Memorial through December 31, 2013 be approved. Terms: \$175 per Sunday (14 hours per week); vacation: 2 weeks and any Sunday the Pastor needs off; conduct worship at 11:00 a.m. each Sunday, assist in church programs, serve communion; give guidance when needed, conduct funerals.
- 20. (CA) The renewal of the covenant as Lay Supply for James Dempsey and Smithers through December 31, 2013 be approved. Terms: \$150 per week (20 hours per week); vacation: 1 week plus if Pastor needs time off, upon request; conduct worship 9:30 every Sunday; visitations, funerals, communion; advise Session, keep Session abreast of events at Presbytery, Synod and General Assembly; special services and programs.
- 21. (CA) The renewal of the covenant as Lay Supply for William I. Hairston and Westminster (Charleston) through December 31, 2013 be approved. Terms: Salary: \$1,080.46 per month (10 to 12 hours per week); travel reimbursement at the IRS rate (special travel that the Session determines); vacation/study leave: 4 weeks; conduct Sunday services at 11:00 a.m., special services as determined, home visitation, hospital visits, family counseling and conflict resolutions, attend meetings, offer advice, prepare devotions, represent the church at community meetings and events, attend special meetings as determined.
- 22. (CA) The renewal of the covenant as Lay Supply for Gail Rymer and Hughes River through December 31, 2013 be approved. Terms: Salary: \$125 per week; vacation/study leave as required; conduct services on Sunday at 11:00 a.m. on the first, second and fourth Sundays of the month, special service times as they may occur; pastoral care of those in need as requested; inform Session of scheduling changes or other related information; cooperate with other churches in the area.
- 23. (CA) The renewal of the covenant as Lay Supply for Jerry M. Woodyard and Red Sulpher Springs through December 31, 2013 be approved. Terms: Salary: love offering (10 hours per week); conduct worship on Sundays at 11:00 to noon on first and third Sundays, and one fifth Sunday, of the month; preach the Word, occasional visitation.
- 24. (CA) The renewal of the Stated Supply covenant for Ralph Judd Alford, II and Ridgeview Brush Creek through December 31, 2013, be approved. Terms: Cash salary: \$155 per week (designated as housing allowance; includes mileage)(8 hours per week); preach and lead worship at 11:00 on Sundays (4 or 5 per month); fill in for Sunday school superintendent/adult Sunday school teacher during absences; moderate Session and congregational meetings; assist Session in making decisions; assist in Men/Women organizations and other special programs; visit members and non-members; work with youth; vacation: 2 Sundays.

- 25. (CA) The renewal of the Stated Supply covenant between Cinda G. Harkless and Beverly Hills through December 31, 2013 be approved. The Christian Nurture and Worship Committee provided information about several up-coming events.

COMMITTEE ON REPRESENTATION

Recommendation:

1. (Consent Agenda) That the Presbytery receive the report of the Committee on Representation for permanent record, in satisfaction of the requirements of the <u>Book of Order G-3.0103</u>.

INFORMATION:

The Committee on Representation has reviewed the membership of persons ELECTED to service on the committees of the Presbytery. Staff support was not included for statistical analysis, nor were the memberships of "Affinity" groups such as the Stewardship of Creation. While such affinity groups are encouraged to fulfill the mandate of <u>Book of Order F-1.0403</u>, their membership lies beyond the scope of the Presbytery's Nominating Committee and thus, that of the Committee on Representation.

For 2012, the elected members of Presbytery included 77 males and 58 females. Further, the elected classes include 78 Ruling Elders and Laity, 54 Teaching Elders and 3 CLPs.

Inasmuch as the committee structure of the Presbytery is in transition, a committee-by-committee analysis of the membership would be of little guidance to the Nominating Committee for its future work. Also, as the Presbytery is transitioning from a Quadrant system of organization and representation to a Cluster model, the 2012 numbers by quadrant would serve no more than an historical interest. These are available upon request.

COMMITTEE ON PREPARATION FOR MINISTRY

INFORMATION

- A. Enrolled Eric Springer, member of First Church, Huntington, as an Inquirer. Eric is in his first year at Louisville Presbyterian Seminary.
- B. Interviewed Nancy Martin, ALP and temporary supply at the Oak Hill Church. She submitted a statement of faith and was examined in the areas of Christian faith, the Bible, Sacraments, polity, and views in theology. The committee recommended her as ready to receive a call as a Commissioned Lay Pastor to the Committee on Ministry.

- No one is allowed to speak more than once on a pending question until all wishing to speak have been heard; a person can then speak a second time, but no more than twice (unless the body gives special permission by two-thirds vote for a third speech).
- B. Relevant Provisions of Presbytery's Manual (Section III of Manual)
 - "No new business shall be introduced after Presbytery recesses for lunch (unless by two-thirds vote
 Presbytery sets a different deadline for introduction of new business), and any new business not listed
 on the Docket shall be presented in written form."
 - "...each elder elected an officer, Executive Presbyter, or a member of Council of Presbytery shall be enrolled as a member of the Presbytery for the term of office, whether or not commissioned by his or her session, in accordance with G-3.0306."
 - 3. "The privilege of the floor without vote shall be granted to lay members of Presbytery's committees and to laypersons serving on Presbytery's staff, if not enrolled as members of the Presbytery."
 - 4. "The privilege of the floor without vote shall be granted to professional church educators serving the churches of Presbytery, if not enrolled as members of the Presbytery."

NOTE: The phrase, "privilege of the floor without vote," means that the person has the privilege of speaking on the floor of Presbytery, including debating a motion under consideration, subject to rules and guidelines that govern discussion and debate. However, the person does not have the privilege to make motions or to vote.

Those who have "privilege of the floor without vote" are lay members of committees, lay members of Presbytery staff, church educators, and youth advisory delegates. Those with "voice and vote" privileges are member ministers, elder commissioners, Commissioned Lay Pastors, Executive Presbyter, Stated Clerk, Recording Clerk, Treasurer, Vice-Moderators, Moderator, and Council Members.

- C. Procedural Rules for the meeting of Presbytery (approval by two-thirds vote required to adopt #3).
 - 1. Persons wishing to speak to the Presbytery giving a report, debating a motion, raising questions will do so by using the microphones.
 - 2. Each speaker, after recognition by the Moderator, will give his or her name and church name (or other relationship to the Presbytery if not pastor or elder commissioner from a session).
 - 3. Limitation of Debate 30 minutes per main motion, with each individual limited to 3 minutes per speech.
 - 4. A recommendation from a committee or other entity elected by the Presbytery, upon being presented to Presbytery by an elected member of that entity, is considered to be on the floor for Presbytery's debate, amendment, and disposition without the necessity of a motion placing the recommendation on the floor

APPENDIX H

SECOND AMENDMENT TO COVENANT By and Between THE PRESBYTERY OF WEST VIRGINIA And THE FRIENDS OF BLUESTONE

This **SECOND AMENDMENT** (the "Amendment"), dated as of the latest signature date, to the Covenant (as defined below) is entered into by and between The Presbytery of West Virginia, a non-profit organization, with offices in South Charleston, West Virginia ("PWV"), and The Friends of Bluestone, a West Virginia non-profit corporation with offices in Princeton, West Virginia ("FOB"). PWV and FOB are each a "Party" and collectively the "Parties".

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, the Initial Term of the Covenant terminates, on December 31, 2012; and,

WHEREAS, the FOB has met the provisions Article 1.2 of the Covenant; and,

WHEREAS, Article 1.3 of the Covenant provides that the Parties may mutually extend the agreement (Second Renewal Term)

NOW, THEREFORE, both Parties desire to amend and revise this Covenant to sustain the ministry of Bluestone. The amended terms are as follows:

1. Article 1-Term

- 1.1 The Second Renewal Term of this Covenant shall commence on January 1, 2013 and continue through December 31, 2020 during which the PWV and FOB will cooperatively work to develop financial support solutions for Bluestone, including, but not limited to, a capital campaign and facilitating increased retreat and usage revenue by the PWV and outside groups.
- At no point during the Term shall the cash contributions of the PWV be less than four (4) percent of the annual budget. The specific cash contributions of the PWV and the FOB shall be determined in 2012 (for 2013 & 2014), 2014 (for 2015, 2016, & 2017), and 2017 (for 2018, 2019, & 2020) during the Second Renewal Term of the Covenant. Upon expiration of the Second Renewal Term, the cash contributions from FOB will be measured against 90% of the accumulative goals set forth in Article 5. Should these benchmarks not be achieved, unless otherwise agreed to by both parties, this agreement shall terminate automatically.
- 1.3 By December 31, 2013 the FOB will submit a Financial Plan to the PWV specifying support through the remainder of the Second Renewal Term.

1.4 Should the goals described in Article 1.2 be satisfied, a continuation of the Covenant beyond expiration of the Second Renewal Term, Additional Renewal Terms may be contemplated, and the Parties may mutually extend the agreement (Third Renewal Term, Fourth Renewal Term, etc.) and update the Business Plan as shown in Article 5 for each agreed to time period.

2. Article 5 – Funding Provision for the Renewal Term

5.1 Year 2013

- (a) PWV will commit to (i) an annual cash contribution of \$40,000, or (ii) should general economic conditions require a reduction in the overall PWV budget, the annual cash contribution in (i) above to Bluestone will be no less than four percent of the PWV annual budget.
- (b) FOB will contribute a minimum of \$42,500 cash, disbursed as per Article 4, through the efforts of its annual fund.

5.2 Year 2014

- (a) PWV will commit to (ij) an annual cash contribution of \$35,000, or (ii) should general economic conditions require a reduction in the overall PWV budget, the annual cash contribution in (i) above to Bluestone will be no less than four percent of the PWV annual budget.
- (b) FOB will contribute a minimum of \$45,000 cash, disbursed as per Article 4, through the efforts of its annual fund

Definitions

Capitalized terms used herein shall have the same meaning as defined in the Covenant unless they are otherwise defined.

4. Conflicts

In the event of a conflict between the provisions of this Second Amendment and those of the Covenant, the provisions of this Second Amendment shall govern and control.

5. Entire Agreement

This Second Amendment contains the entire agreement of the Parties with respect to the Covenant, and hereby expressly supersedes and replaces any of the other agreement, whether written or oral, with respect thereto.
