A-1 Being the Church for the Sake of the World

B-1 Get Out: Rethinking the Role of the Church in Community

This presentation will include specifics about the Adverse Childhood Experience Study, as well as data connecting high ACEs scores with children in foster care, adults experiencing homelessness and substance use disorder. In addition, there will be conversation about how we cope with our own ACEs, as well as those we work with in our communities.
