Recommendation for Special Procedural Matters Regarding Electronic Meetings & Suspension of Any Manual Rules That Interfere with Them

The Stated Clerk recommends:

That the November 19 stated meeting of the Presbytery of West Virginia (PWV) be conducted by gathering electronically through the online platform of ZOOM with participants ordinarily using devices with both audio and video.

That, for the purpose of meeting electronically by ZOOM, these will be the special procedural matters, and any manual rules that interfere with them be suspended:

- 1. Participants in the PWV ZOOM Stated Meeting will be minister of the Word and Sacrament members (M), Ruling Elder Commissioners (RE), Commissioned Pastors (CP), Ruling Elders serving on the Leadership Team (LT), Presbytery Committee Members (PCM), Corresponding Members (CM), and any visitors present (V).
- 2. Only registered participants will be enrolled and permitted into the ZOOM meeting.
- 3. All registrants are strongly encouraged to participate in one of the live orientation sessions prior to the PWV ZOOM Stated Meeting.
- 4. All participants will be required to pre-register no later than three days before the meeting.
- 5. Participant access to the PWV ZOOM Stated Meeting will begin at 9 AM, thirty minutes prior to the start of the meeting. If a participant has been "in" the meeting and gets disconnected, every effort will be made to readmit them into the meeting.
- 6. The PWV Stated Clerk and Temporary Clerks shall establish the presence of a quorum, upon reviewing the participants' list in ZOOM, then informing the Moderator, who will then make a declaration of a quorum present.
- 7. Participants may seek recognition by the Moderator using the chat feature or by using the electronic raised hand feature. The Stated Clerk and the Temporary Clerks will monitor these features. The Stated Clerk will advise the Moderator of participants seeking recognition.
- 8. New business must be submitted to the Stated Clerk via email prior to the start of the General Presbyter Report.
- 9. While every effort will be made to provide stable access to ZOOM, each participant is responsible for their audio and internet connections; no action shall be invalidated on the grounds that the loss of, or poor quality of, a participant's individual connection prevented participation in the meeting.

PROCEDURAL MATTERS

- A. Principles of Parliamentary Law
 - Courtesy to all One Item at a time
 - Majority rule Respect the rights of the minority
 - Justice for all Partiality for none
 - Usually pro and con speakers will alternate and individual speaking will identify his or her position.
 - No one is allowed to speak more than once on a pending question until all wishing to speak have been heard; a person can then speak a second time, but no more than twice (unless the body gives special permission by two-thirds vote for a third speech).
- B. Relevant Provisions of Presbytery's Manual (Section III of Manual)
 - 1. "No new business shall be introduced after Presbytery recesses for lunch (unless by two-thirds vote Presbytery sets a different deadline for introduction of new business), and any new business not listed on the docket shall be presented in written form."
 - 2. "...each elder elected an officer, General Presbyter, or a member of Leadership Team shall be enrolled as a member of the Presbytery for the term of office, whether or not commissioned by his or her session."
 - 3. "The privilege of the floor without vote shall be granted to lay members of Presbytery's committees and to laypersons serving on Presbytery's staff, if not enrolled as members of the Presbytery."
 - 4. "The privilege of the floor without vote shall be granted to certified church educators serving the churches of Presbytery, if not enrolled as members of the Presbytery. Certified church educators who are ruling elders and serving churches of Presbytery shall have voice and vote privileges. (G-2.1103b)"

<u>NOTE</u>: The phrase, "privilege of the floor without vote," means that the person has the privilege of speaking on the floor of Presbytery, including debating a motion under consideration, subject to rules and guidelines that govern discussion and debate. However, the person does not have the privilege to make motions or to vote.

Those who have "privilege of the floor without vote" are lay members of committees, lay members of Presbytery staff, church educators, and youth advisory delegates. Those with "voice and vote" privileges are member Teaching Elders, Ruling Elder commissioners, Certified Christian Educators*, Commissioned Ruling Elders, General Presbyter, Stated Clerk, Recording Clerk, Treasurer, Moderator, Members of Leadership Team and Presbytery Committee chairs.

- C. Procedural Rules for the meeting of Presbytery (approval by two-thirds vote required to adopt #3).
 - 1. Persons wishing to speak to the Presbytery giving a report, debating a motion, raising questions will do so by using the microphones.
 - 2. Each speaker, after recognition by the Moderator, will give his or her name and church name (or other relationship to the Presbytery if not pastor or elder commissioner from a session).
 - 3. Limitation of Debate 30 minutes per main motion, with each individual limited to 3 minutes per speech.
 - 4. A recommendation from a committee or other entity elected by the Presbytery, upon being presented to Presbytery by an elected member of that entity, is considered to be on the floor for Presbytery's debate, amendment, and disposition without the necessity of a motion placing the recommendation on the floor.

Motion Basics

STEPS OF THE MOTION

- 1. Commissioner rises and addresses the Moderator.
- 2 *Moderator* recognizes commissioner and grants the floor.
- 3 *Commissioner* makes motion. (Commissioner may not debate before the motion is seconded.)
- 4. Another commissioner seconds the motion without recognition from the moderator.
- 5. *Moderator* states the motion.
- 6 *Moderator* calls for debate. (Maker of the motion has the privilege of first debate.) All speakers must address the moderator and be recognized by the moderator.
- 7. *Moderator* states the motion.
- 8 *Moderator* takes the vote and announces the vote and the results of the vote.
- **9.** *Moderator* states the next order of business.

SEVEN USEFUL MOTIONS

- **1. Amend.** There are *only* three forms of simple amendment.
 - a. to delete or strike out
 - **b.** to add or insert
 - c. to strike out and insert

The words proposed for deletion or addition *must be consecutive words*. When the amendment does not involve consecutive words or is longer than a paragraph, the motions "to substitute" (a form of amendment) is used. This is a difficult motion and should *never* be used when the simple form of amendment can be used.

- 2 Commit or Refer. To commit or refer back to committee for further study and amendment allows the consultative process to be used in greater depth. When this motion is made, it needs to state clearly what committee; appointment of the committee, if necessary; the task of the committee; and report time.
- **3.** Postpone to a Particular Time. This motion takes precedence over the preceding two and has the power to grant additional time to a particular member or committee or do further study or consultation. It should always be used in preference to "table" because it permits debate on the propriety of postponement.
- **4.** Limits on Debate. The assembly always has the power, and the moderator the right of suggestion, to limit debate to a particular hour, or extend or shorten speeches according to the necessity of the moment. Limits on the length of speeches are advisable in instances where the issue before the assembly is highly divisive and many members wish to speak.
- **5.** Previous Question. The maker of the motion "to move the previous question" (close debate and immediately take the vote) must be recognized by the moderator and the motion must receive a second. *It is never in order when called from the floor*. This motion should never be considered when it is used to prevent legitimate debate.
- **6.** Lay on the Table. This motion is seldom necessary. The motion "to postpone" is always preferable because of its lower rank and its debatability. Misuse of this subsidiary motion can be a strategy that seriously abridges the rights of the assembly because of its high rank and its adoption by a majority vote without debate. The moderator is obliged to explain carefully to the assembly the implications of this motion should it be made.
- 7. Consideration by Paragraph or Seriatim. Consideration by paragraph or seriatim is an incidental motion that may be suggested by the moderator or any two members of the assembly, allowing for orderly consideration of a complex proposal with several different parts, clarifying for the assembly the controversial aspects of the proposal. Each paragraph of the proposal can be amended without finally adopting the new wording until the final action on the main motion as amended.

PRESBYTERY OF WEST VIRGINIA REPORT OF THE GENERAL PRESBYTER

November 19, 2020

I have found this past quarter, August-October, to be far easier than the preceding two. As you can see below, most of the worship services I have attended have been in person, and I have almost resumed a normal preaching schedule. It also feels like I have gotten back on track with my visits with pastors. That's been encouraging since those are the two parts of the job that I enjoy the most.

However, there are still Zoom meetings, often three a day, sometimes more. That's the new normal. In fact, that might remain the norm even after a vaccine is developed. Meeting virtually saves time and money. A side benefit is that they may also be more comfortable in that I can get away with wearing jeans or shorts, depending on the weather. The desk chair in the office, however, is far more comfortable than the one I use at home.

Rather than simply waiting for things to get back to normal, I think we will be better served if we make the assumption that this is the new normal, and we begin to focus our efforts on three areas of ministry.

One would be developing content. That would include worship services, as well as Bible and book studies. Here, we need to think about not only church members and the people in our community, but also those who connect with us online. That may include people who have grown up in the church or the community, as well as people who just stumble upon us somehow.

Although McDonald's may have backed off making their breakfast items available 24/7, there are still probably people out there who would like to have an Egg McMuffin in the middle of the afternoon or at 9 at night. Similarly, there are people out there who might have other commitments at 11 a.m. on Sunday. If your worship service is online, they can access it at 11 p.m. Sunday or 5 p.m. Monday or 8 a.m. Wednesday. If you have a Bible study on Romans, people might just access it at 2 a.m. if they can't sleep or they might decide to binge watch it to see what you have to say and what they can learn. Generating content and making it available online expands our ministry, enhances our outreach, and increases the chances that we will be able to connect with more people in more places than we ever have before.

One of our ordination vows has us pledge to serve the people with energy, intelligence, imagination, and love. While that probably refers to the people of the church, I don't think it's that much of a stretch to broaden it to include all people, even outside the church. What kind of content can you imagine? What kind of content do your people need? What kind of content do they want? How can you provide that in a way that's life-giving to you and to them without wearing yourself out? I think those are some of the questions we need to be wrestling with.

The second area of ministry I think we need to focus on is connection. How can we connect with the people we serve and the people we are reaching online, two similar but different challenges?

Hospitals and nursing homes have restricted outside visitors. Older members may be reluctant to have visitors in their home, even if they like having their pastor visit them. With colder temperatures, outside visits are even less likely to happen. How do we connect with our church members? Perhaps having virtual office hours when people can stop by for a virtual visit. Maybe making phone calls. Maybe setting up small group Zoom meetings or conference calls, so you can connect with four, five or six people at a time. Maybe offering prayer meetings on Zoom or by conference call would provide a chance to connect.

Connecting with people who watch our content online is even more of a challenge. We may not even know their name or where they live, let alone have a chance to ask them how they are

doing or how we might help them. It just seems that there has to be a way to work around that and discover how we might connect with them. It strikes me that we're almost developing two different congregations, one where we know their names and who have taken membership vows and one where we only see them online. It's like serving two yoked churches. While there are similarities between the two, there are also differences. We can't assume one size fits all, and we have to treat each one with respect.

The third area of ministry we need to focus on is governance. While I prefer meeting in person, I think all of us need to get over that.

How do we make decisions when we can't meet in person? How can we make sure everyone's voice is heard? How can we be better at permission giving while recognizing the potential health risks and recognizing that just because I don't like something and wouldn't want to be involved doesn't mean that it won't help others and be a good use of the pastor's time and energy, as well as the church's money? I think it's harder to have those kinds of discussions online than it is in person, but I also think we need to figure out a way to have better discussions and make better decisions in our online meetings.

It is a changing world. It is a challenging world. While it makes me tired, it also makes me excited to think about the opportunities we have. God is at work in the midst of this pandemic. Focusing on these three areas of ministry will help us discover more ways that God can use us now.

PRESBYTERY OF WEST VIRGINIA REPORT OF THE LEADERDHIP TEAM

Steve Hornbeck, Leadership Team Chair November 19, 2020

RECOMMENDATIONS:

- 1. The Leadership Team nominates the following to serve on the Committee on Representation, Class of 2023:
 - Pam Johnson (Ruling Elder, Riverlawn)
 - Rich Cardot (minister)
- 2. The Leadership Team nominates Pam Johnson (Ruling Elder, Riverlawn) to serve as the Chair of the Committee on Representation for 2021.
- 3. The first reading of a proposed Manual revision

That Presbytery approve the revisions immediately following this report to the Manual of Administrative Operations for the Presbytery of West Virginia.

Rationale: The Leadership Team began discussing the three-year commitment of nominees to serve as Moderator Elect, Moderator, and Leadership Team Chair in 2019. Concerns were raised regarding the leadership skills needed to be a good moderator and chair; some felt that the skill set needed for the roles was too diverse. At the Leadership Team's request, Amy Wallace Parker, former Presbytery Moderator, convened a meeting of former Presbytery moderators focused on their experiences. This group reported its recommendation to the team to split the Moderator Elect/Moderator role from the Leadership Team Chair role. The Leadership Team approved this recommendation. Items I through IV accomplish this.

Currently, the manual does not allow for electronic or virtual meetings. Item V allows the Presbytery to meet electronically.

The coronavirus pandemic has revealed a need for designees of the Presbytery to make decisions in order for the business of the Presbytery to continue between meetings. Item VI adds approval of loans to the existing powers granted to a group of three of the following: the Moderator of Presbytery, Chair of the Leadership Team, Stated Clerk, and General Presbyter at the recommendation of the Trustees. Item VII grants the Leadership Team authority to appoint Administrative Commissions to address in a timely manner the dissolution of a congregation and to inquire into reports of churches affected with disorder or experiencing difficulty.

INFORMATION:

- 1. The Leadership Team endorsed the plan of the Bluestone Committee to create an RV camping area at the facility to supplement its income stream and expand its mission and ministry.
- 2. The Leadership Team completed a survey of congregations regarding Presbytery programming, including activities and events, and resources that will be used in upcoming conversations on the future of the Presbytery and the best use of its resources. This discussion will be the focus of the annual Leadership Team retreat in 2021.
- 3. Due to the ongoing coronavirus pandemic, the Leadership Team approved calling for a virtual meeting for the February 20, 2021 Stated Presbytery Meeting. The team extends thanks to the Beckley Presbyterian Church who had graciously agreed to host the meeting. Presbytery looks forward to meeting at the church in the future.
- 4. The Leadership Team reviewed and approved the docket for the November Presbytery meeting.
- 5. The Leadership Team set the dates for its annual retreat on January 11-12, 2021. The retreat will be held virtually.
- 6. The team heard the report of the New Life Congregational Grant Review Team. The review team met on October 29, 2020. Treasurer Rocky Poole reported to the review team that the grant fund had a balance of \$538,241. The review team considered the application submitted by the Teays Valley Presbyterian Church. A New Life Congregational Grant of \$9,995 was awarded to the church to purchase equipment to enhance TVPC's online ministry program. The Grant Review Team plans to increase efforts to publicize the grants. The next application deadline is January 1, 2021.

Manual Revisions: First Reading – November 19, 2020

- I. Strike lines 260-267. Add Ordinarily, the Moderator-Elect, who was elected at a previous Stated Meeting, will become the Moderator for the next year. If the candidate is a Minister of the Word and Sacrament, the following candidate shall be a ruling elder. If the candidate is a ruling elder, the following candidate shall be a Minister of the Word and Sacrament. The Moderator shall serve a term of two (2) years as Moderator and is not eligible for reelection. Ordinarily, the Moderator shall be installed at the last Stated Meeting of the year, and will take office immediately. Consideration shall be given when nominating persons to serve as Moderator to assure appropriate gender, race, and geographic diversity.
- II. Insert at line 276: In the event that a moderator is unable to complete their term for whatever reason, the moderator-elect shall become the moderator. If there is no moderator-elect in place, the last previous moderator willing to do so shall assume that position until such time as the Committee on Representation can nominate a person to serve as Moderator for the remainder of that term. Ordinarily, the election and installation of the new moderator shall take place at the next Stated Meeting of the presbytery.
- III. Strike lines 281-286. Add Upon nomination by the Presbytery's Committee on Representation and election by the Presbytery, the Moderator-Elect shall ordinarily be elected to serve for three years in the following roles: Moderator-Elect, one year, and Moderator, two years. The formula for electing the Moderator shall govern the selection of the Moderator-Elect candidate. Ordinarily, the Moderator-Elect shall be installed at the last Stated Meeting of a year, and will take office immediately. Consideration shall be given when nominating persons to serve as Moderator-Elect to assure appropriate gender, race, and geographic diversity.
- IV. Strike lines 422-423. Add The Committee on Representation shall nominate a person to serve as Chair of Leadership Team. Ordinarily, the chair is an active member of the team; care should be taken to assure service by both ruling elders and ministers of Word and Sacrament. The Leadership Team Chair shall be elected annually, with eligibility for reelection. The Leadership Team Chair shall not serve more than three consecutive years.
- V. Strike line 159. Add the language below.

Presbytery may meet electronically. A blend of traditional meeting and electronic meeting is permissible. When considering whether to meet traditionally or electronically, consideration should be made regarding the best way to complete the business at hand, safety of Presbyters, and the cost, both financial cost and the cost of time to the members of the committee, and the following:

- 1. Electronic meetings must provide for simultaneous aural communication in order to allow for discussion of the issue(s) being considered. Collaborative technologies such as webbased Zoom, GoToMeeting, and other interactive video teleconferences, as long as they allow access by telephone, fit the necessary requirements for maintaining the deliberative character of meetings held in accordance with the most recent edition of Robert's Rules of Order.
- 2. The Leadership Team shall determine whether an electronic meeting best serves the needs of Presbytery.
- 3. Ordinarily, notice of electronic meetings shall be given at least one month before a Stated Meeting and in the announcement for a called meeting. The platform to be used for the meeting shall accompany the call for the meeting. Instructions on how to participate technologically shall be given to registrants at least three days prior to the meeting.

Electronic meetings are similar to traditional meetings in the following ways:

- 1. A quorum for an electronic meeting shall be the same as traditional meetings.
- 2. Just as in a traditional meeting, electronic meetings shall begin and close with prayer.
- 3. The same rules regarding participation apply to electronic meetings as in traditional meetings.
- 4. Motions shall be processed in the same manner as a traditional meeting.
- 5. The Moderator, in consultation with the Stated Clerk, shall determine the appropriate method of voting for each motion under consideration, taking into account those participating on the telephone.
- 6. Minutes for an electronic meeting shall be the same as minutes of a traditional meeting.

VI. Add bold text into line 166.

In matters of the sale or purchase of property **and approval of loans up to \$ 100,000**, which cannot wait until the next scheduled meeting of Presbytery, decisions may be made by any three of the following leaders: the Moderator of Presbytery, Chair of the Leadership Team, Stated Clerk, and General Presbyter with the advice of the Trustees with all such decisions to be reported to the next stated meeting of Presbytery by the Trustees.

VII. Insert text at line 177.

The Leadership Team shall have the authority to appoint Administrative Commissions to address in a timely manner the dissolution of a congregation, inquire into reports of churches affected with disorder or experiencing difficulty. Such action shall be reported to the next stated meeting of the Presbytery.

INFORMATION:

The Committee on Representation seeks to review and advise the Presbytery regarding the implementation of principles of diversity and inclusion in our committees, boards, and other leadership positions. To evaluate how Presbytery is doing in these areas, a survey was developed and sent to pastoral leaders, committee chairs, members of the Leadership Team, and leaders of affinity groups.

Following is a summary of those results.

Several of the areas indicate the Presbytery is doing a commendable job, including maintaining balance of gender, laity/ruling elders/clergy, and representing a variety of geographical areas. Presbytery is successful accommodating schedules and reaching out to small churches and those with disabilities. There are other areas that indicate there is room for improvement, while two areas showed the Presbytery is doing a poor job. Those areas are: 1) representing a variety of racial ethnic groups in our leadership, committees, and staff; and 2) having representation of persons of color and indigenous groups in leadership and committee roles. It should be noted that there were several comments referring to these two points. Overall, the statements concluded that the state of West Virginia is not that diverse, nor is it made up of a variety of racial ethnic citizens. Therefore, it would be difficult to accomplish this balance and have diverse representation due to the demographics of our state.

The COR will consider the results of this survey as it seeks members for the various committees and leadership roles. The committee will strive to find people of color and indigenous groups as well as search for those who represent racial ethnic groups whenever possible.

Most committees during 2020 have had to make changes to the way they meet. Zoom and conference calls have become the "norm." While the person-to-person contact has been missed, many groups have been successful in carrying out their business via these methods, and the committee anticipates Zoom as being an option for meeting in the future.

PRESBYTERY OF WEST VIRGINIA REPORT OF THE NURTURE COMMITTEE

Sue Ellen Hollandsworth, Committee Chair November 19, 2020

INFORMATION:

- 1. The committee reviewed five applications for scholarships and loans for post-secondary education. All were awarded scholarships from the Scholarship Fund and Riner loans.
- 2. The Resource Center continues to add books and other resources, as well as now offering training in some new computer skills Nellie Howard has acquired.
- 3. The Youth Council will have a retreat in November pending parental approval and the state Covid-19 map colors.
- 4. The Festival of Faith was a success thanks to the work of the committee and the flexibility of all presenters. The next one is scheduled for March 20, 2021 with Diana Butler Bass as the keynote presenter. This event will again be via Zoom. The committee plans to offer some Zoom training to the presenters.
- 5. The Expanding Your Ministry Toolbox course with Tom Long was very successful with one of the largest attendance numbers. It was offered via Zoom as was the final 2020 offering on November 7, Intergenerational Ministry.
- 6. The Educator, Clergy, Commissioned Pastor, Authorized Lay Preacher Retreat in February will be via Zoom with Rabbi Victor Urecki presenting "Difficult Texts in the Old Testament."
- 7. The committee's greatest challenge is the inability to offer many of the usual programs for Presbytery youth. We have had to cancel many events over the last several months and continue to cancel into 2021, including the Intergenerational Day of Service. We have been able to continue to offer creative and inspiring worship services for the Presbytery meetings despite the restraints of Covid-19 and time.

PRESBYTERY OF WEST VIRGINIA REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES

James Robinson, Trustees Chair November 19, 2020

RECOMMENDATION:

1. That Presbytery agree to guarantee Edgewood Presbyterian Church's loan for \$40,000 from the Presbyterian Investment and Loan Program (PILP) and authorize Stated Clerk Maureen H. Wright to execute the loan guarantee on behalf of the Presbytery of West Virginia.

Rationale: Edgewood Presbyterian Church, Lewisburg, will use the loan for replacement of its roof and for interior repairs to the sanctuary building caused by water damage from the leaking roof. The loan is for a period of 15 years.

- 1. Closed on sale of the Beverly Hills church property on August 19, 2020. Proceeds of \$159,338, of which \$127,470 goes to the New Life Congregational Grant fund.
- 2. Met via Zoom on October 1, 2020 to discuss the loan request from Edgewood Presbyterian Church. Since we had a few questions, we asked to meet with a few Session members. Met on October 5, 2020 via Zoom with them, and they answered our questions. Voted to recommend approval to Presbytery.
- 3. The Lakeview Presbyterian Church, Lakebottom, has been sold to a neighbor without cost or benefit to the Presbytery of West Virginia. Due to questions regarding the reversion title, the Presbytery has no claim to the property.
- 4. Closed on the sale of two lots from the dissolved Westminster Presbyterian Church, Charleston, on October 13, 2020. Proceeds of \$41,512.50, of which \$33,210 goes to the New Life Congregational Grant fund.

PRESBYTERY OF WEST VIRGINIA REPORT OF THE BLUESTONE COMMITTEE

Denny Dodson, Committee Chair November 19, 2020

- 1. The committee voted on and approved the suspension of the Fall Retreat Season. We had made the same decision about holding off on Summer Camp and the Summer Retreat Season due to the danger of the spread of Covid-19. This was another difficult decision, but at this time, it was pretty much "cut and dry" with the reality of the pandemic.
- 2. The committee again has applauded the work of the Program Director and the Facilities Director for their forward thinking. Both contributed greatly to the virtual experience that took place during the summer and the online Facebook and Instagram posts, which have continued routinely to keep Bluestone up front in people's minds throughout the year. We hope to provide some winter programming, especially during the Advent Season, through the virtual experience.
- 3. The committee has approved tentatively going forward with a plan to establish a small RV Camping area below the swimming pool towards the "point" on the facility's grounds. We are still awaiting approval from the Army Corps of Engineers, and a positive response from our Presbytery insurance provider. This will not only be a possible revenue source for other programs, but it will also enable us to expand our ministry opportunities for Presbyterian and non-Presbyterian visitors. We are also considering some renovations to a few of the cabins, making them more conducive to being rented out for off-season individuals and families. We have presented this concept to the Presbytery Leadership Team and have obtained their endorsement for this positive opportunity for extended ministry.
- 4. Bluestone Conference Center Inc. (BCC) made an application to the Small Business Administration (SBA) for an Economic Injury Disaster Loan (EIDL). On August 6, the SBA approved the loan. The BCC board of directors held a called meeting on Monday, August 17 to approve accepting the loan and to authorize Treasurer Rocky Poole to sign all required documents. An SBA loan agreement and note were signed and submitted on Tuesday, August 18. On Wednesday, August 19, the loan proceeds were received. Below are the details and terms of the loan:
 - \$25,000 principal, unsecured 2.75% fixed interest rate
 - Payments deferred 12 months
 - Amortization of 30 years, \$107 monthly payment
 - No prepay penalties, but cannot be prepaid during payment deferral period
 - Eligible expenses include fixed debt payments necessary to maintain the current status of long-term debts; payments of ongoing fixed expenses, such as payroll, rent, utilities, and insurance premiums
