# **Presbytery Highlights**

Meeting of the Presbytery of West Virginia May 16, 2024

The Presbytery met at Clifton Presbyterian Church, Maxwelton, Dawn Adamy (minister, Bream Memorial) presiding. The meeting was opened with prayer. Stephen Baldwin, pastor of the Clifton and Ronceverte churches, welcomed the Presbytery and recognized co-host Ronceverte Presbyterian Church. Members attending through Zoom were greeted. The highlights of the meeting are shared below.

<u>Approved</u> the <u>Consent Agenda</u>, which included the requests for excused absences, the designation for the offering to go to the Korea Hana Foundation, and authorization of five ruling elders to serve communion in their churches of membership.

<u>Listened</u> to a brief overview of the General Assembly provided by <u>Transitional General Presbyter</u> Maureen Wright. The 226<sup>th</sup> General Assembly will meet in Salt Lake City, starting on June 30, and will elect comoderators. Those standing for co-moderators are: CeCe Armstrong, associate pastor in the Charleston-Atlantic Presbytery, along with Tony Larson, pastor in New Harmony Presbytery and Marian McClure Taylor, retired member of Mid Kentucky Presbytery, along with Danny Morales, chaplain and pastor in Tropical Florida Presbytery. A panel of those who have served as commissioners to the General Assembly responded to questions regarding their experiences. Members of the panel were John Bolt (RE, First Morgantown), Jim Musgrave (RE, Highlawn Huntington), Andy Rice (minister, Oak Grove), Susan Sharp Campbell (minister, Frankford), and Tina Vial (RE, Davis Memorial Elkins).

<u>Heard</u> announcements from Se Hwan Isaiah Kim (minister, First Hinton) sharing that the Korea Hana Foundation is an organization that assists North Korean refugees settle in South Korea and Mark Miller (Bluestone Camp Director) who reminded the Presbytery that registration is open for Bluestone Camp & Retreat's summer camp. Colleen Earp, Program Director at Massanetta Springs Camp and Conference Center, offered greetings to the Presbytery and highlighted their summer 2024 programs.

<u>Worshipped</u> with Se Hwan Isaiah Kim who preached the sermon; and Sue Hollandsworth (ruling elder, Oak Grove) who served as liturgist. Ministers of

Word and Sacrament Chris Kilbert (Riverlawn) and Marietta Macy (First Charleston) presided at the celebration of the Lord's Supper. Music was provided by Julie Gillilan, organist for Ronceverte Presbyterian Church. The celebration of the Lord's Supper included blessing bestowed by the Moderator and Leadership Team Chair Randy Fife (RE, Bream Memorial).

**Collected** \$1,027 for the offering to the Korea Hana Foundation.

<u>Heard</u> the report of the **Stated Clerk**, Maureen Wright (ruling elder, Village Chapel). She highlighted the Presbytery's 2023 Statistical Report that offers a snapshot of the Presbytery. The report reflects a change in total membership of the presbytery at 5,895, a loss of 295 members from 2022.

<u>Listened</u> to the report of the **Transitional General Presbyter**, Maureen Wright. She acknowledged that the land on which we met and live belonged to the native peoples who inhabited West Virginia long before white settlers arrived. Maureen shared prayer concerns from around the Presbytery. She expressed gratitude for the Leadership Team and the committees of the Presbytery as well as those who made the meeting possible, and recognized and thanked the presbytery staff. She shared reflections on using church buildings and property as tools for ministry and mission. She challenged the churches of the Presbytery to engage in conversation about their buildings as resources or as a burden.

Heard the report of the Leadership Team, presented by chair Randy Fife. He presented the second reading and recommendation to change to the Presbytery manual clarifying the Presbytery boundaries by county as part of a denomination-wide effort to clarify the boundaries of all presbyteries. The Presbytery approved the recommendation. He presented an update on the team's work for A Season of Discernment that seeks to determine what God is calling the Presbytery to be and do. The goal is to present a recommendation to the Presbytery at its November meeting outlining a vision for the Presbytery including a committee structure and staffing model to fulfill the vision.

<u>Commissioned</u> Chris Kilbert and Susan Shelton Perry (ruling elder, First Logan) our General Assembly Commissioners and Emma Rau (Highlawn Huntington), our Young Adult Advisory Delegate to the 226<sup>th</sup> General Assembly. Moderator Adamy led the Presbytery in a liturgy of commissioning.

<u>Heard</u> the presentation of the financial reports by Chris Alfred, **Financial** Administrator/Treasurer.

<u>Listened</u> to the report of the **Mission Committee** presented by Sharon Bell (minister, Highlawn Huntington), chair of the committee. She told the

Presbytery, "There's an app for that!", inviting congregations to submit Hunger and Mission grant applications.

<u>Heard</u> the report of the Administration Committee presented by Monte Mitchell (minister, Beckley), chair of the committee. He announced the hiring of two part-time employees, Kathryn Willoughby Weed as Associate for Ministry to the Aged and Leslie Bremar as Administrative Assistant to the Stated Clerk.

<u>Celebrated</u> Good News from the Pews where Ruling Elder Commissioners from churches throughout the presbytery shared good news of mission and ministry.

<u>Listened</u> to the report of the Bluestone Committee presented by committee member Debbie Taylor (ruling elder, Old Stone). She encouraged churches to send kids to summer camp.

<u>Heard</u> the report of the Committee on Representation presented by Susan Perry, chair of the committee. She nominated Pamilla Ferrell (ruling elder, First St. Albans) for a three-year term as Recording Clerk of the Presbytery and Jim Musgrave (ruling elder, Highlawn Huntington) to serve on the Administration Committee in the class of 2026. There were no nominations from the floor. Both were elected.

<u>Listened</u> to the report of the <u>Trustees</u> presented by member Randy Fife. The Trustees recommended Presbytery approve up to \$75,000 to replace the flat roof and repair the shingled roof of the Ruffner Memorial Presbyterian Church, Charleston, to list the property for sale with Goldman Associates. The Presbytery approved the recommendation.

<u>Heard</u> the report of the **Committee on Ministry**, presented by chair George Lilley. He presented a recommendation to create an Administrative Commission to inquire into the life, ministry, and vitality of the Anderson Memorial Presbyterian Church, Welch. The presbytery approved the recommendation.

Moderator Adamy reminded Presbytery to review the printed reports of the **Nurture**, **Relations**, **Stewardship**, and **Vocations** committees. These reports were included in the meeting packet.

The meeting was adjourned with prayer by Moderator Adamy.
